## Final Minutes for the

## Ad Council Meeting on October 12<sup>th</sup>, 2021

Ben opened the meeting with a prayer.

Ad Council acknowledged and accepted the previously amended September 8th 2021 Meeting Minutes

#### **Trustee Committee:**

- Council acknowledged that the Food Pantry and Thrift Shop will co-share the old basement Sunday school room (the room in-between the library and Food Pantry).
- ➤ Clean out old Nursery Room to support Marlene's "card making activities" currently located in the basement Sunday School Room.
- ➤ Water leaks under stairs and near front door. Masonry contractor required. Council to be advised of repair costs prior to work commencing.
- Fellowship Hall
  - o Renovations: Trustees have proposed to install a new drop ceiling with lighting
  - Freezer: Council approved the purchase of replacement freezer; Trustees to proceed with purchase and installation.
- ➤ Electronic Church Bells
  - o Ad Council agreed with Trustees' suggestion to install a Carillion system.
- ➤ Hedge Row
  - Jim to schedule this project with the Boy Scouts
- ➤ Bat Issue "2.0" Ehrlich Update
  - o At this Council meeting, it was reported that bats were spotted again exiting the Sanctuary attic space. Ben agreed to again notify Ehrlich.
  - It was also noted that we were told by Ehrlich, that their Technician is supposed to inspect both of our attic spaces on a monthly basis. In addition, Ehrlich Technicians did not perform their duties.
  - And Ben also believes that Ehrlich's bat exclusion proposal did not cover any future cleanup services required by another firm
  - Starting October 12<sup>th</sup>, 2021 John Mackay on behalf of the Trustees Committee, has accepted responsibility for managing bat issues.

### Missions & Ministries

- Missions
  - Arc to start cleaning on October 14th with 2 workers
  - Council approved Annie to order 4 packs of Advent Calendars recommended by Jen Rooney (~\$36.00)
  - Missions current total account balance

\$2,304.49

- ➤ Loaves of Love
  - Currently, the Food Pantry serves about 12 clients who visit Loaves of Love <u>plus</u> an additional 6 clients to whom food is delivered to their residences
    - Reminder that the Food Pantry had never closed their doors during the pandemic
    - Food Pantry clients can shop by picking and choosing their goods
    - For those receiving food via home deliveries, our dedicated group of volunteers:
      - Receive orders over the phone
      - Pack orders in boxes, including refrigerated and frozen products
      - Then make the requested deliveries
  - As has been previously reported, the Loaves of Love Food Pantry has graciously received the following <u>outside funds</u> in 2021:
    - **\$4,000 Grant** from Norwescap
      - Grant received end of March and needed to be spent by end of May'21
        - With the substantial increase in food pantry products, additional storage capacity was needed
      - Grant distributed as follows:
        - o \$ 3,000 Food
        - o \$ 500 Household products
        - o \$ 500 Parking lot snow plowing
    - \$1,200 cash donation from Lebanon Reformed Church
    - \$1,000 in credit from ShopRite Corporation for spending only at Norwescap
  - Also, the Food Pantry had received during the summer, hundreds of pounds of fresh produce and vegetables from Grow-a Row, in Pittstown
- **Easton Mission** 
  - o 30 meals were made/assembled and delivered

#### **New Business:**

- Proposed Book Donation Bin by Lesley
  - o Council approved the Book donation bin
  - o Trustees to determine bin location on church parking lot
- ➤ Council agrees that the RVUMC Website needs to be updated.
  - Question remains by whom?

- ➤ Council approved the reinstatement of Counters
- ➤ Council approved Love Offering of ~ \$1,000.00 to support Bound Brook UMC recovery
  - Council agreed to donate as "seed" money (\$826) consisting of 4<sup>th</sup> of July proceeds, UMW checking account closure and an unknown source
  - o Lesley told Ben/Gail to make the bank deposit for all funds supporting this Love Offering
- ➤ Council approved to share Ad Council Meeting Minutes with Congregation
  - Ben will send Minutes to Pastor Sam who will include in distribution in both emails and Sunday Bulletins
